



Health and Safety

The Iwade@TheBarn Trust has overall responsibility for health and safety in the barn. It is the intention of the Trust to comply with all Health and Safety legislation and to act positively where they can reasonably do so to prevent injury, ill health or any danger arising from activities and operations in the barn.

All hirers of the barn are expected to read this policy and to recognise that it is their duty to comply with the procedures and safety requirements, including safety notices at the premises.

It is the duty of all trustees, contractors, hirers and visitors to take care of themselves and others who may be affected by their activities to do everything they reasonably can to prevent injury to themselves and others and to co-operate with the Trust in keeping the barn safe, including the grounds and car park.

If anyone using the barn becomes aware of any faults, damage or other situations which might cause injury and which cannot be rectified immediately, they should inform Lisa, our bookings coordinator, on bookings@iwadebarn.org.uk or the Trustees on trustees@iwadebarn.org.uk as soon as possible so the situation can be dealt with.

Routine reviews, checks and inspections of safety procedures and equipment are conducted by the Iwade@TheBarn Trust.

The Trust carries out an annual risk assessment to assess and examine all activities, a decision is then made as to whether enough precautions are in place or whether further actions are required. These risk assessments also help the Trust to comply with various laws and regulations contained in a wide range of legislation. A copy of the current risk assessment can be found in the information folder, kept in the main barn.

A copy of the emergency evacuation procedure is displayed on both exit doors.

The first aid box and the accident book are located in the main barn. All accidents must be reported to the trustees on trustees@iwadebarn.org.uk.

A copy of our public liability certificate is displayed in the main barn.
